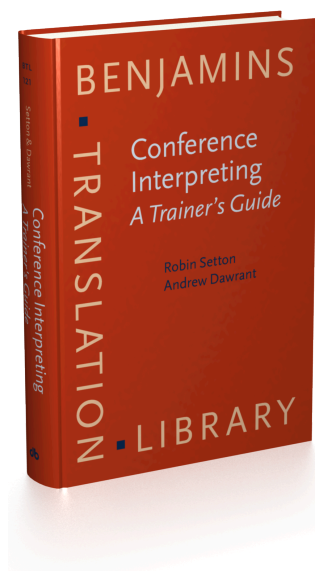
Robin Setton and Andrew Dawrant
