Transliteration symbols are used for spelling Arabic lexical items and proper names using roman letters. Phonemic transcription symbols are used for representing phonological forms. The phonemes corresponding to $\langle \dot{z} \rangle$ and $\langle \dot{z} \rangle$ vary according to dialect; symbols for the emphatics vary according to authors' usage.

Allophonic and narrow phonetic transcriptions follow the conventions of the International Phonetic Alphabet unless otherwise stated. Transcription for other languages is described where relevant.
