ABRAHAM:	Old Testament patriarch, receiver of God's covenant (Genesis 11–25). <i>M</i>
ADAM:	The first man and a sinner (Genesis 2–5). <i>M</i>
ARMENIA:	Home of Joy's mother; Joy's heritage. <i>M</i>
ARMENIANS	Joy's own people. <i>M</i>
ARRAS:	City in northern France (now in the Pas-de-Calais). <i>M</i>
ARTESIANS:	Natives of Artois. <i>M</i>
ARTOIS:	A former French county on the border of present-day Belgium. <i>M, JB</i>
AUXERRE:	City southeast of Paris (at present in the Yonne), in a wine-growing region. <i>JB</i>
BAGHDAD:	One of the extremes of the King of Scotland's search for his wife. <i>M</i>
BAVARIANS:	Natives of what is now southern Germany. <i>M</i>
BEAUVAISIS:	Area around Beauvais, now in the Oise. <i>M</i>
BERRY:	Former country, south of Paris. <i>M</i>
BERTHA:	Woman of the village. <i>T</i>
BERWICK:	Principal port of Scotland (prob. Berwick-on-Tweed). <i>M</i>
BLOIS:	City on the Loire (now in the Loir-et-Cher). <i>JB</i>
BLONDE:	Daughter and heiress of the Earl and Countess of Oxford. <i>JB</i>
BOULOGNE:	Formerly Flemish port on the Channel, now in the Pas-de-Calais. <i>JB</i>
BOULONNAIS:	Men of the Boulogne area. <i>M</i>
BRABANTERS:	Men from Brabant (now Belgium). <i>M</i>
BRETONS:	Men from Brittany, in the west of France. <i>M</i>
BRUGES:	Important city of Flanders (now Belgium). <i>M</i>
CHAMPENOIS:	Men from Champagne, a large region in the east of France. <i>M</i>
CLERMONT:	Town north of Paris (now in the Oise). <i>M, JB</i>
CORBEIL:	Town (now in the Essonne) south of Paris and southwest of Dammartin. <i>JB</i>
CORBIE:	Town in Picardy (now in the Somme). <i>JB</i>
CORNWALL:	The westernmost peninsula of England, part of the King of Scotland's domains. In the Middle Ages its population was largely Celtic. <i>M</i>

CREIL:	Town north of Paris, between Clermont and Senlis (now in the Oise). <i>M</i>
DAMMARTIN (in Goële):	Town, castle, and surrounding area northeast of Paris, now in the Seine-et-Marne; it becomes John's fief when he is made count. <i>JB</i>
DAMME:	The port of Bruges in the Middle Ages. <i>M</i>
DAVID:	Old Testament king, author of the Psalms (1 Samuel, 2 Samuel). <i>M</i>
DOVER:	English port on the Channel. <i>JB</i>
DUNDEE:	Principal residence of the King of Scotland. <i>M</i>
ELIZABETH:	Mary's cousin (Luke 1). <i>M</i>
ENGLAND:	Land by which Scotland is placed on the literary map (<i>M</i>); land of opportunity for an ambitious young man (<i>JB</i>).
EPERNAY:	Town east of Paris, south of Rheims (now in the Marne); site chosen for a tournament. <i>M</i>
EVOLINT, EVOLINC, ELUIC, ELUINT:	A town and its nearby castles, the dower land of the King of Scotland's mother and her residence after her son's marriage. It cannot be located precisely. <i>M</i>
EVE:	The first woman and a sinner (Genesis 2–5). <i>M</i>
FLANDERS:	Modern Belgium. Its count welcomes the King of Scotland. <i>M</i>
FLEMINGS:	Men of Flanders. <i>M</i>
FRANCE:	In medieval texts, usually the Île-de-France (the Parisian region). In <i>M</i> it is the northern part of the country, famous for tourneying. <i>M, JB</i>
FRENCHMEN:	Participants in the Gournay-Ressons tournament. <i>M</i>
FRIESLAND:	Northern Netherlands; the King of Scotland's last stop in his fruitless search. <i>M</i>
GERMANS:	Participants in the Gournay-Ressons tournament. <i>M</i>
GHENT:	City in Flanders. <i>M</i>
GLOUCESTER:	English county contiguous to Oxfordshire. <i>JB</i>
GOURNAY:	Town north of Clermont, marking the far limit of the great tourney in <i>Manekine</i> .
GRAVELINES:	Formerly a Flemish port between Calais and Dunkirk (now in France [Nord]). <i>M</i>
GREATER INDIA:	Another extreme in the King of Scotland's search. <i>M</i>
GUY, Sir:	One of the two messengers dispatched by King Louis to the Earl of Oxford. <i>JB</i>
HERMESENT:	The salter's wife. <i>T</i>
HERSENT:	Woman of the village. <i>T</i>
HESDIN:	Town south of Boulogne (now in the Pas-de-Calais). <i>JB</i>
HUNGARY:	Native country of Joy. <i>M</i>
HUREPOIS:	Men from a region east of Paris. <i>M</i>
IRELAND:	Part of the King of Scotland's dominions. <i>M</i>

JOHN:	(1) Son of Joy and the King of Scotland. <i>M</i> (2) Hero of <i>John and Blonde</i>
JORDAN:	River of the Holy Land. <i>M</i>
JOY:	Heroine of <i>Manekine</i> .
LENS:	Town north of Arras (now in the Pas-de-Calais). <i>M</i>
LENT:	A penitential season during which tourneying and eating meat were proscribed. <i>M</i>
LIART:	Robin's horse. <i>JB</i>
LILLE:	City formerly of Flanders, now of France (Nord). <i>M</i>
LONDON:	The English capital. <i>JB</i>
LOUIS:	King of France. (Although no number is given in <i>JB</i> , the reigning kings at the time of Philippe de Remi were Louis VIII and Louis IX.)
LUZARCHES:	Town north of Saint-Denis (now in the Val-d'Oise). <i>M</i>
MANEKINE:	Alias of Joy.
MANESSIER, Sir:	Brother of John. <i>JB</i>
MEHAUT:	Woman of the village. <i>T</i>
MERC:	Merch-St.-Liévin (Pas-de-Calais) (Suchier's suggestion). <i>JB</i>
MONTDIDIER:	Town north of Paris (now in the Somme), home of "Walter." <i>JB</i>
MONTMELIANT:	Town and area northeast of Dammartin (Seine-et-Marne). <i>JB</i>
MONTREUIL:	Town now in the Pas-de-Calais. <i>JB</i>
MOREA:	State in the Peloponnese founded by Crusaders. <i>JB</i>
MOREL:	The Earl of Gloucester's warhorse, won by John. <i>JB</i>
NORMANS:	Natives of Normandy and participants in the great tourney. <i>M</i>
OXFORD:	Town and county in south-central England, home of Blonde. <i>JB</i>
PERTH:	City in Scotland to which the dowager queen retires during her son's wedding celebration. <i>M</i>
PHARE:	River (Fiumicino) running through Rome and into the sea. <i>M</i>
PLAILLY:	Town and area north of Dammartin (Oise). <i>JB</i>
POITEVINS:	Men from Poitou, a province southeast of Paris. <i>M</i>
POIX:	Town southwest of Amiens (now in the Somme). <i>M</i>
PONTOISE:	Town near Paris, to the northwest (Val-d'Oise), within a few kilometers of Philippe's home. <i>JB</i>
RESSONS (Ressons-sur-Matz):	Town (Oise) marking one limit of the tourney in <i>M</i> and very close to the domain of Philippe de Remi.
RICHAUT:	Woman of the village. <i>T</i>
ROBERT, Sir:	Brother of John. <i>JB</i>
ROBIN, ROBINET:	John's trusty servant. <i>JB</i>
ROME:	Seat of the Pope, home of the Senator, Joy's refuge for seven years. <i>M</i>

ROYE:	Town north of Paris (now in the Somme). <i>M</i>
SAINT AMANT:	Apostle to Flanders. <i>M</i>
SAINT BADOUL:	An invention of the Earl of Gloucester? <i>JB</i>
SAINT-DENIS:	Town north of Paris (now a suburb). <i>JB</i>
SAINT-OMER:	Town west of Boulogne (now Pas-de-Calais). <i>M</i>
SAINT PETER'S:	The main church in Rome. <i>M</i>
SAINT-POL, Count of:	Husband of one of John's sisters. <i>JB</i>
SCOTLAND:	Chief part of the King of Scotland's domains. <i>M</i>
SENLIS:	City north-northwest of Paris (now in the Oise). <i>M</i>
SENS:	Cathedral city southwest of Paris (Yonne). Dammartin is roughly halfway between it and the Channel.
SWABIANS:	Men from a region of southwest Germany. <i>M</i>
TARSUS:	City in Turkey. <i>M</i>
THEOPHILUS:	Churchman whose pact with the devil was widely known. <i>M</i>
TRINITY:	Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. <i>M</i>
TRISTAN:	Lover of Iseut and hero of many tales. <i>JB</i>
TRISTAN, Sir:	Brother of John. <i>JB</i>
URBAN:	Pope (no number is given). <i>M</i>
VERMANDOIS:	Region northeast of Paris, east of Amiens (now the Aisne). <i>M</i>
VIRGIN:	Mary, mother of Jesus. <i>M, JB</i>
WALTER:	John's pseudonym. <i>JB</i>
WILLIAM, Sir:	A messenger sent to the Earl of Oxford by the King of France. <i>JB</i>
WISSANT:	French port between Calais and Boulogne. <i>M</i>
YSE:	River in Hungary, flowing into the sea. <i>M</i>
