

EDITORIAL PRACTICE, SYMBOLS, MANUSCRIPTS, AND ABBREVIATIONS

THE text of Samuel Taylor Coleridge's talk in this volume follows the record by Henry Nelson Coleridge in manuscript diaries of 1822–7 and 1830–4. Appendix A lists abbreviations in the manuscripts that have been expanded for clarity. Initials have been expanded into proper names for persons and places identified within the entries in which they occur either in manuscript or in editions published by Henry Coleridge. The few names not so identified but reasonably certain have been supplied within square brackets. Ampersands have been expanded. Throughout the text and apparatus the infrequent square brackets enclose editorial interpolations. The divisional bars between entries are Henry Coleridge's except where indicated. The dates are his and are given in his varying form, but his division bars beneath dates have been omitted. Punctuation has been freely modified, usually towards the changes in *Table Talk* (1835), but dashes are retained where they may preserve the rhythm of Coleridge's speech. Henry's indentation of paragraphs has been ignored.

The textual apparatus, signalled by superscript letters in lower-case italics, records those words in the manuscripts, other than the abbreviations listed in Appendix A, that have been modified in the present edition. The apparatus indicates as cancelled those words crossed through by Henry Coleridge; words overwritten but legible are so indicated. Cancelled letters that leave the intended word uncertain are not recorded. Words inserted above the line are accepted into the text without notice.

Major changes of the text in the 1835 or 1836 editions are remarked in the editor's footnotes, which are numbered and printed in double columns. Minor variations between the manuscripts and the 1835 edition are not noted. The presence or absence of pairs of small triangles in ink at the top of the various pages in the manuscripts, which seem to have been used in checking the material, has not been recorded.

The text of the second edition (1836) is included in this edition as the first appendix in the second volume, Appendix H. There the dates, headings, and divisional bars between entries are retained as published, with bars supplied from the manuscripts or 1835 edition where an entry ended at the bottom of the page in 1836. The topical "Contents" and index of 1836 are omitted. The latter part of the Preface of 1835, which Henry Coleridge thought too ephemeral to reprint in 1836, is included within square brackets, as are other passages dropped between 1835 and 1836. Entries published in 1835 but dropped in 1836 are inserted where

they originally appeared. Each entry is given a sequential number, in square brackets, preceded by 35 for those few entries published in 1835 but dropped thereafter; e.g. [35:426]. As dates and sequence vary between the manuscript and 1835 versions, those entry numbers, in square brackets, appear for cross-reference at the end and to the right of the corresponding entries in the manuscript version. Entries without such numbers have not been published in any previous edition of *Table Talk*.

All of John Taylor Coleridge's contributions to *Table Talk* have been gathered in an opening section. Coleridge's talk recorded by him in 1811 and sent by him for publication at the end of Henry Coleridge's volumes is here reprinted from the first edition. The account of Coleridge's talk of 9 Jan 1823, published under 1 May 1823 (36:47), is given from John Taylor Coleridge's diary, as published in Bernard Lord Coleridge *This for Remembrance* (1925) 324–61, and the anecdote by him published as a footnote to 30 Jul 1831 (36:311n) is given in this edition from his commonplace book, now in the Library of the University of Pennsylvania. Talk reported by others and included in the present edition is distributed among appendixes, the editor's introduction, and footnotes to particular topics. In quotations from these works single quotation marks have been changed to double and missing initial or end quotation marks have been silently supplied.

Editions referred to in the footnotes are, where practicable, those Coleridge used.

Coleridge manuscripts, where quoted, are printed literatim, including cancellations, except that "it's", "its' ", "your's", "yours' " have been standardised to "its" and "yours". The following symbols are also used in quoting from mss (with "wild" as an example):
