1250–1517: Mamluk sultanate in Egypt (in Syria, 1260–1516).

1291–1327: Rule of Jaime II, king of Aragon.

1310–41. Third reign of the Mamluk sultan al-Nasir Muhammad ibn Qalawun.

1327-36: Rule of Alfonso IV, king of Aragon.

1346–7: First outbreaks of the Black Death in the Middle East and Europe.

1487: Embassy between Sultan Qaytbay (r. 1468–96) and Lorenzo de' Medici (r. 1469–92) of Florence.

1496: Destruction of trees and buildings in the garden of Matarea.

1517: Ottoman conquest of Egypt.

1615: Death of the last balsam tree in Matarea.

1696: Death of the sycamore fig in Matarea.

1761–7: Danish Arabia expedition led by Pehr (Peter) Forsskål.

1798–1801: Napoleonic campaign in Egypt and Syria.

1800: Battle of Heliopolis.

1883: Construction of a chapel in Matarea by College of Jesuits in Cairo.

1906: Death of the second sycamore fig tree in Matarea.
