## NOTE AND GLOSSARY

Japanese names throughout are given in the traditional Japanese order of family name followed by Christian name. The system of romanisation employed in this book is the British Standards Institute Specification for the Romanization of Japanese. Thus when the names of Japanese people, places, production companies, etc. are mentioned in the text they are not italicised and long vowels are not marked (Oshima rather than Ōshima, etc.). However the titles of films, books and less familiar Japanese terms (giri, ninjō, seishun, etc.) are italicised and long vowels are marked with a macron. Where English titles include Japanese words long vowels are not marked – thus Japanese Zatōichi but English Zatoichi, etc.
