The following key explains the abbreviations I have used to identify citations from Nietzsche's writings. Lower-case instances of these abbreviations are meant to identify citations from Nietzsche's review of his books in *Ecce Homo* (citations from other chapters of *Ecce Homo* are designated by 'Wise', 'Clever', 'Books' and 'Destiny'). Citations from Prefaces and Epigraphs are designated by P and E, respectively. In all instances, numbers refer to sections rather than to pages.
