This map illustrates the administrative divisions of medieval Japan into provinces. The provinces are labeled as follows:

- North Island (Hokkaido):** Dewa, Mutsu.
- Central Island (Honshu):**
 - North: Noto, Echigo, Echizen, Echū, Kaga, Shinano, Kōzuke, Shimotsuke, Hitachi.
 - Central: Mino, Owari, Mikawa, Tōtomi, Suruga, Izu, Kai, Musashi, Sagami, Kazusa, Shimōsa.
 - South: Ise, Shima, Yamato, Kii, Tosa, Iyo, Sanuki, Awa, Bizen, Bitchū, Bingo, Aki, Suō, Iwami, Izumo, Inaba, Harima, Tanba, Taino, Wakasa, Ōmi, Mino, Owari, Mikawa, Tōtomi, Suruga, Izu, Kai, Musashi, Sagami, Kazusa, Shimōsa.
- South Island (Shikoku):**
 - North: Iki, Chikuzen, Chikugo, Buzen, Bungo, Higo, Hyūga.
 - South: Iwami, Izumo, Inaba, Harima, Tanba, Taino, Wakasa, Ōmi, Mino, Owari, Mikawa, Tōtomi, Suruga, Izu, Kai, Musashi, Sagami, Kazusa, Shimōsa.
- Southwest Island (Kyushu):** Tsushima, Iki, Chikuzen, Chikugo, Buzen, Bungo, Higo, Hyūga, Satsuma, Chūmei.

This inset map shows the geographical circuits of medieval Japan, which were larger administrative regions. The circuits are labeled as follows:

- San'in:** Located in the northwest, covering parts of the North and Central Islands.
- Kinki:** Located in the central-western part of Honshu, covering parts of the Central and South Islands.
- Toa:** Located in the eastern part of Honshu, covering parts of the Central and South Islands.
- Shikoku:** The entire island of Shikoku.
- Kyūshū:** The entire island of Kyushu.
