

## Note on the Text

THE CONTRIBUTIONS IN THIS VOLUME maintain the orthography found in the editions from which texts are quoted. Where passages are inserted from eighteenth-century first editions, for example, particularities and idiosyncrasies in spelling and punctuation have been maintained. The only exceptions to this rule are the use of hyphenation, which has been modernized from “ſ” to “-” throughout (e.g., “Religionsſ Unterricht” becomes “Religions-Unterricht”), and quotation marks, which have been standardized throughout according to the guidelines in the *Chicago Manual of Style*.

Inevitably, with a volume like this, individual authors have referred to various different works and collected editions. Details of abbreviated references to these editions are given in the individual essays.
