

Editor's Note

This volume of the *Haskins Society Journal* includes papers read at the 20th Annual Conference of the Charles Homer Haskins Society at Cornell University in October 2001 and at other conferences in the year following the Haskins. The papers by Dave Postles, Bernard Bachrach and John Gillingham were featured papers at the Haskins Conference; the latter was the Warren Hollister Memorial Lecture. The paper by Alan Cooper received the 2001 Bethell Prize, which was judged by Bernard Bachrach.

Subscribers will note that this volume, number 12, follows number 11 in order of publication but not in order of subscription year. Volume 11 was the first of three back issues to be issued between regular numbers of the *Journal*. Volumes 13 and 14 will likewise be back issues. Next year's volume, numbered 15, and all subsequent volumes will then be 'properly' numbered, with subscription years and volume numbers corresponding in order. I would like to thank the members of the Haskins Board and the other referees I called on for assistance with the refereeing of submissions, and Lynne Miles-Morillo and Ben Scanlon for assistance with copy editing.
