

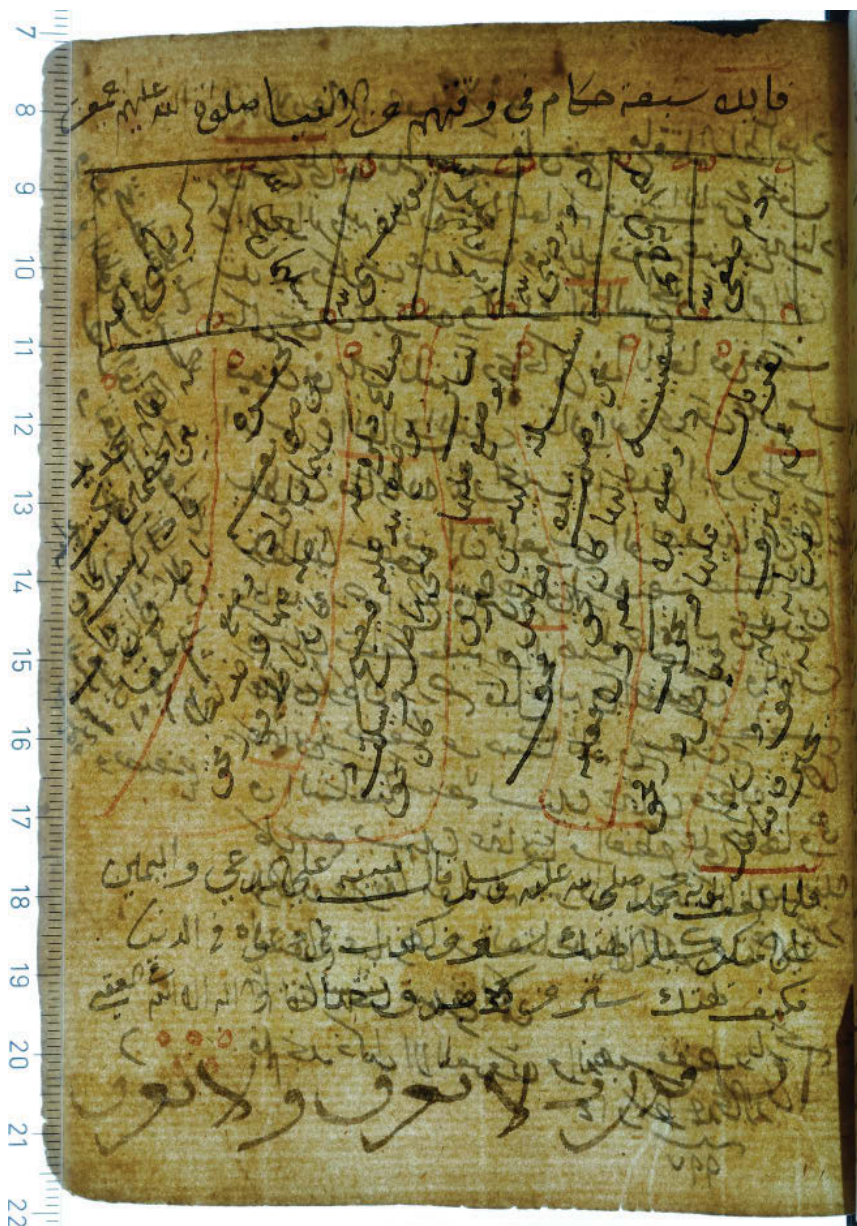

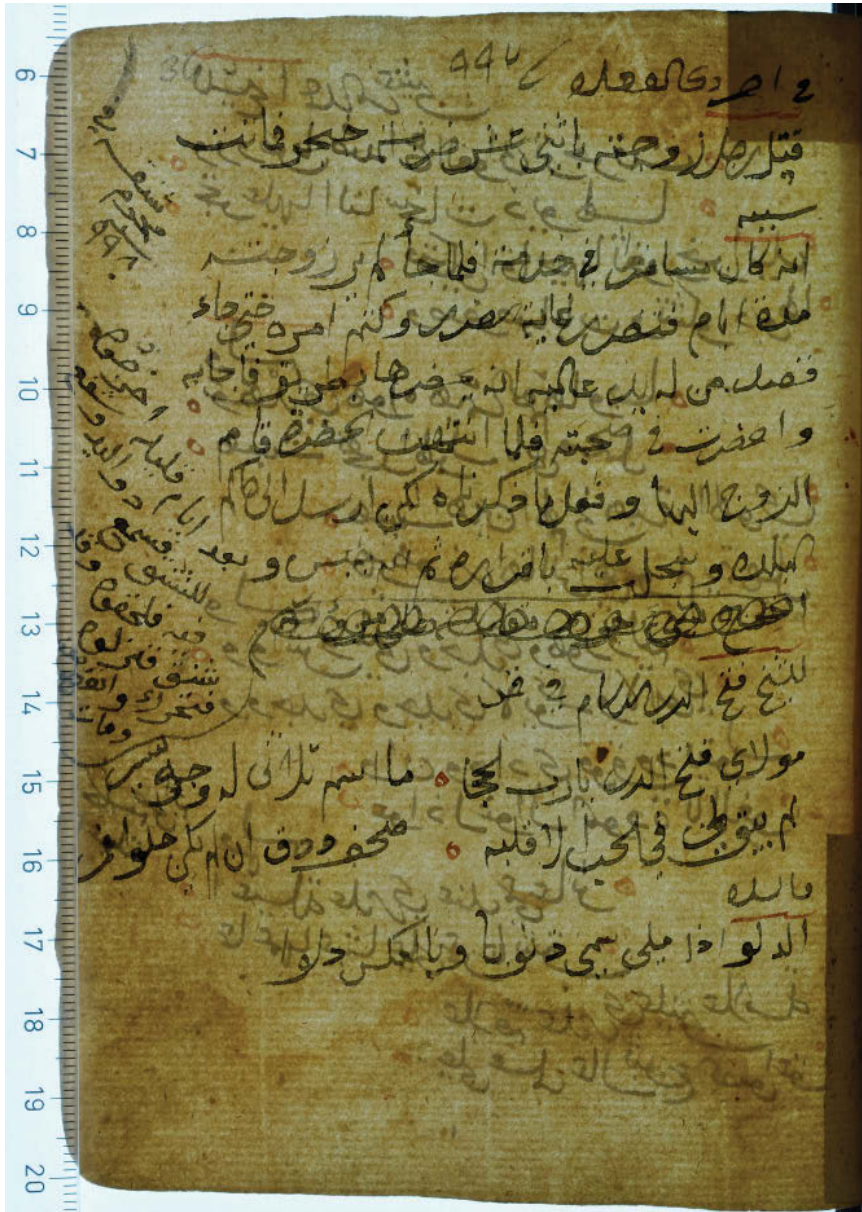
Fragment of a watermark on the upper right part of the page: two isosceles triangles, probably two brims of a hat. Gotha orient. A 114, fol. 18.

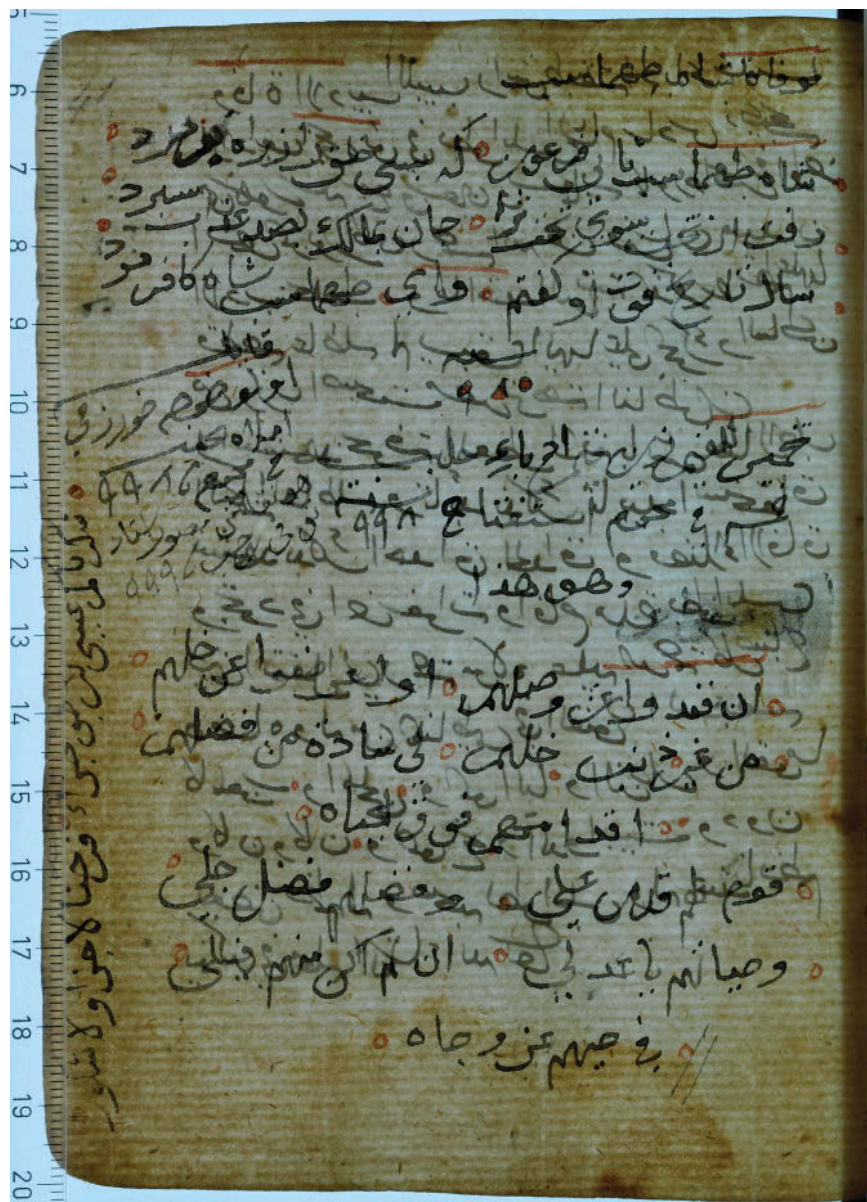
Fragment of a watermark on the lower right part of the page: bull's horns.

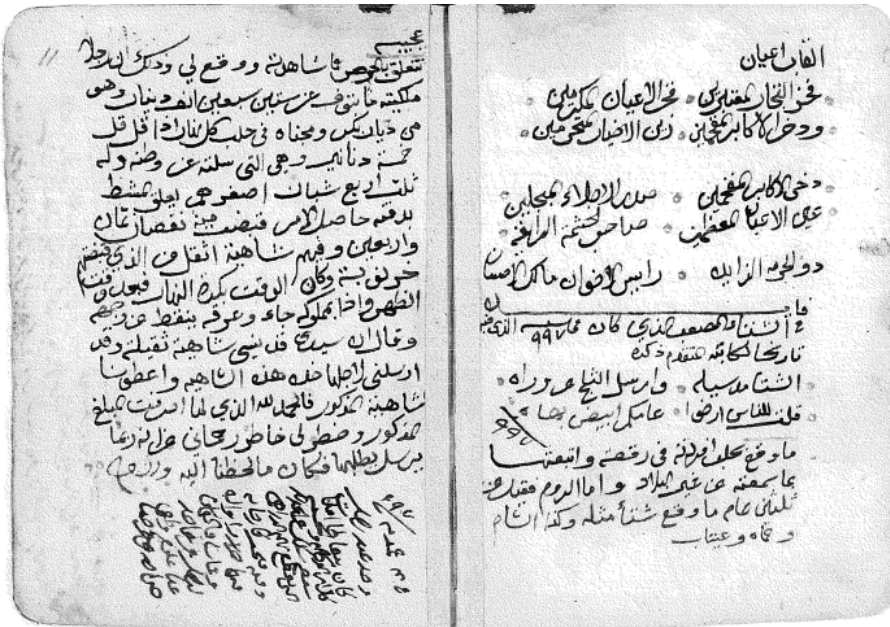
Fragment of a watermark on the upper right part of the page: bull's head with eyes. Gotha orient. A 114, fol. 36.
