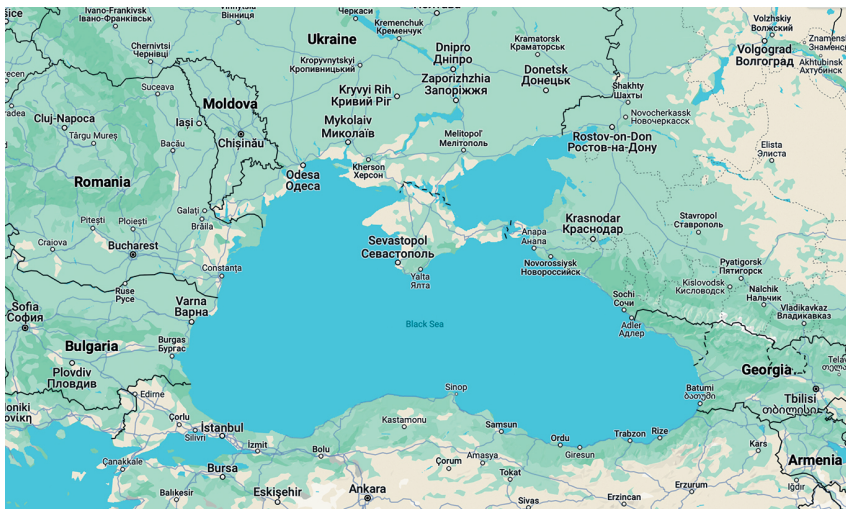


Fig. 2: Contemporary Map of the Black Sea Region.
