Allen T. Alexander is Associate Professor of Innovation and Circular Economy at the University of Exeter Business School, Penryn Campus, where he is a senior researcher currently exploring various aspects of Circular Economy. His research focuses particularly on food and agribusiness, sustainability and Circular Economy.
