## Date Convention

Dates in this thesis are given in both Islamic and Christian calendars. If a general date according to century is required, it will be given in the form of the Islamic century followed by the Christian century: first/seventh century. If a specific date is given, it will be given in a form such as 40/661, meaning AH 40 and AD 661. Occasionally, the context will require just one date to be given and, in those cases, it will be made clear whether the reference is to a Christian or an Islamic date.

## Manuscript Reference

Specific locations within any given manuscript are given in the form of the folio’s number, the side, and the line number. For example, f.75v, l.9 means the verso side of folio number 75 and line number 9.
