## Directions for Authors

Papers may be submitted to the Editor in English, French, German or Russian, exceptionally in Polish, and should be typed with double spacing on a good quality paper. Manuscripts in small type cannot be accepted. They should not exceed twenty typed pages. Preferably two copies (original and a ribbon or Xerox copy) should be submitted. Formulas and indices should be written with generous spacing and typed if possible; symbols which are not on the typewriter should be inserted by hand in Indian ink. Oblique dash / should not be used in place of parantheses (). Special attention should be paid to distinguishing 1 (number) from 1 (letter). Formulas should be numbered on the left-hand side of the line. The heading of the paper should consist of the author's name followed by surname, in the next line the title of the paper in capitals. Section titles should be written without indention and underlined. Words such as theorem, lemma, proof, corollary, remark, example should be typed in normal text with a space between letters but without underlining. Footnotes should appear at the bottom of the relevant page seperated by a line from the main text. Pages should be numbered in the right upper corner. References to the literature in the text should be numbers enclosed in square bracets and should be listed in alphabetical order at the end of the paper.

The bibliography should be cited as follows:

Books: initials and names of all authors (typed with a space between letters), title, place and year of publication.

Articles: initials and names of all authors (typed with a space between letters), full title, the journal as abbreviated in Mathematical Reviews, volume number (in arabic), year in parantheses, first and last page numbers.

The paper should conclude with indication of the author's place of employment and his address.
