Dear Dr. Lindholm:

The Chemistry and Human Health Division (Div VII) has reviewed the proposal titled “NPU codes for characterizing subpopulations of the hematopoietic linage, described from their Clusters of Differentiation (CD) markers” and has approved this project. The total sum of USD 5000 has been allocated for the project over its lifetime of two years, starting immediately.

Please be aware that Technical Reports and Recommendations resulting from IUPAC Projects should normally be published in *Pure and Applied Chemistry*, although I acknowledge that in this case there may be a different plan. The Bureau has established a procedure to allow publication in other journals in exceptional circumstances where it can be demonstrated by the Task Group and the Division or Standing Committee that publication in another journal is in the best interests of IUPAC. Approval for such an exception should be requested by the Division President from the Secretary General. This request should of course explain why publication in another journal would be preferable to publication in *Pure and Applied Chemistry*.

As Task Group Chair, you are responsible for the approval and monitoring of all expenses associated with your project.
