

DOCUMENTING FIRST WAVE FEMINISMS

Volume II: Canada – National and Transnational Contexts

This book is the second of a two-volume anthology of primary source documents on feminism in the nineteenth and early twentieth centuries. Unique in its extensive treatment of the first wave feminist movement in Canada, it highlights distinct elements of the movement's origins and evolution.

The book is organized under thematic rubrics that address key issues, debates, and struggles within the first wave in Canada, as well as international influences and Canadian engagement in transnational networks and initiatives. Documents by Indigenous, Anglophone, Francophone, and immigrant female activists demonstrate the richness and complexity of Canadian feminism during this period. Together with the first volume, *Documenting First Wave Feminisms* reveals a more nuanced picture, attentive to nationalism and transnationalism, of the first wave than has previously been understood.
