

Studies in Demographic and Administrative History of Ottoman Hungary



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Géza Dávid, born in 1949, studied at the Loránd Eötvös University, Budapest under Prof. Gyula Káldy-Nagy. He began to teach Ottoman history at the same university in 1973, where he became a "*docens*" (approximately senior lecturer) in 1985 and head of the Department of Turkology in 1993. He obtained a Ph. D. degree from the Hungarian Academy of Sciences in 1984.

He wrote a monograph on the 16th century history of the *sancak* of Simontornya (*A Simontornyai szandzsák a 16. században*. Budapest, 1982), prepared a longer study on the fate of the settlements belonging to modern Békéscsaba, a town in southeastern Hungary (*A török hódoltság kora*. In: *Békéscsaba története*. Békéscsaba, 1991, 207-312), and several others in Hungarian, English, German, and Turkish. With Pál Fodor, he is co-editor of the Hungarian oriental journal *Keletkutatás*.
