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Selim Deringil (b. 1951) took his Ph.D from the University of East Anglia in 1979. His thesis later appeared as a book, *Turkish Foreign Policy during the Second World War*, (Cambridge UP 1989). His early work was mostly on foreign policy and diplomatic history of Turkey and the late Ottoman Empire. He has also more recently written on Ottoman Iranian relations, the symbolism of power in ceremonial in the Ottoman context, and Ottoman relations with the Islamic world in general. His recent book is entitled, *The Well Protected Domains: Ideology and the Legitimation of Power in the Ottoman Empire 1876-1909*, (I. B Tauris Publishers, Oxford & New York 1998).
