NOTE ON ANNOTATION

Within my text, reference to fragments of the *Thoughts* is given, after quotation or citation, by abbreviation of the editor's name—Br for Brunschvicg, Ch for Chevalier, L for Lafuma, S for Sellier—followed by the number of the fragment.

Quotation from or reference to other works by Pascal, his contemporaries, and others from the edition of Jean Mesnard, *Oeuvres complètes de Blaise Pascal*, is given, upon first citation or quotation, for the entire pagination in the appropriate volume, including, with rare exception, Mesnard's commentary and annotation. In certain instances, in order to acknowledge Mesnard's particular perspective, I have indicated his commentary in a note. In all annotations of Mesnard's edition I have given his name followed by the volume and page number.

I have also followed this procedure, with occasional exceptions, in the case of Lafuma's *Pascal: Oeuvres complètes*, Philippe Sellier's *Blaise Pascal: Pensées*, and H. F. Stewart's *Les Lettres provinciales de Blaise Pascal*.
