EDWARD B. GRUBB, GEORGE A. HALSEY,	Republican candidate for governor, 1889 Newark leather manufacturer and Republican Congressman, 1866–1868
WILLIAM HEPPENHEIMER,	Jersey City Assemblyman, and State Comptroller, 1891–1894
SIMON KELLY,	Local Democratic boss and Mayor of Weehawken
HENRY C. KELSEY, PATRICK H. LAVERTY, BENJAMIN F. LEE, HENRY S. LITTLE,	Secretary of State, 1871–1892 State Prison Keeper, 1881–1886 Clerk of the New Jersey Supreme Court Monmouth County state senator and Clerk in Chancery
GEORGE C. LUDLOW, WILLIAM McADOO,	Democratic Governor, 1881–1884 Hudson County Democratic boss and Congressman, 1883–1891

JOEL PARKER,	Democratic Governor, 1863–1866, and 1872–1875
WILLIAM W. PHELPS,	Railroad magnate and Republican Congressman
JAMES N. PIDCOCK,	Hunterdon County Democratic state senator; Congressman, 1885–1889
FREDERICK A. POTTS,	Somerset County Republican state senator and candidate for governor
WILLIAM PRALL,	Democratic Assemblyman from Passaic County
THEODORE F. RANDOLPH,	Democratic Governor, 1869–1872, and U.S. Senator, 1875–1881
MILES ROSS,	Middlesex County Democratic boss and Congressman, 1875–1883
THEODORE RUNYON,	Chancellor of the New Jersey Court of Chancery, 1873–1880
WILLIAM J. SEWELL,	Camden County Republican boss, and U.S. Senator, 1881–1887
JAMES SMITH,	Essex County Democratic boss, and U.S. Senator, 1893–1899
JOHN P. STOCKTON,	U.S. Senator, 1865–1866 and 1869–1875; Attorney General, 1877–1897
NOAH D. TAYLOR,	Hudson County Democratic state senator, 1869–1871
GEORGE T. WERTS,	Morris County Democratic state senator and Governor, 1893–1896
JAMES S. YARD,	Railroad tax commissioner
