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Some think there is no such thing as human nature.
For some people this idea becomes translated as,
“everything is possible for man,” and in that they find some hope;
for others, “everything is permissible to man,”
and with that they abandon all restraint;
and others, finally, “everything is permissible against man,”
and with that we have arrived at Buchenwald.
