


Call for Papers

GSGS is an open access journal that aims to play a key role in developing and strengthening knowledge production about gender and sustainability and to promote wider communication among scholars, practitioners and policy-makers around the world. We also hope that it will



be a key vehicle for research on gender and sustainability on topics ranging from social, economic, political, environmental, and cultural issues. The journal will be of interest to researchers, policy-makers, academics, undergraduate and postgraduate students, and practitioners in the fields of gender studies, international development, and sustainable development studies.

We are especially interested in PhD student research and welcome descriptions or abstracts of interesting thesis research. Please consider sending us a two- or three-page submission of your PhD work.

Submission Guidelines

Manuscripts should be original, unpublished, and not under consideration for publication elsewhere. Submissions should be between 6,000 and 8,000 words, including references, tables, and appendices. All submissions should follow the Chicago Manual of Style author date reference style.

Review Process

All submissions will undergo a rigorous double-anonymized peer review process. Authors will be notified of the decision within three months of submission.
