This *NPF ARNOVA-Asia 2024 Special Issue* invites papers that address the conference theme in a wide range of nonprofit, charity & philanthropy, and social economy fields and welcomes both theoretical and empirical studies from all disciplines with a focus on any of the regions of Asia (West, Central, South, Southeast and East Asia).

Please note that submission to this *NPF Special Issue* is open to all authors addressing the conference theme regardless of their participation in the ARNOVA-Asia 2024 conference.
